What is a Certified Family Home (CFH)?

A Certified Family Home provides a safe, family-style living environment for adults with developmental disabilities who need some assistance with their activities of daily living. Usually there are one or two adults residing in a Certified Family Home. Each resident has a tailored care plan designed to meet their individual needs and to ensure they have the opportunity to participate in community activities. The Certified Family Home is operated by a provider who has been certified by the Department of Health and Welfare and demonstrates the knowledge and experience to provide a safe and effective service to the resident(s).

What is a Program Coordinator (PC)?

Program Coordinators offer a person-centered approach to assist the Certified Family Homes in developing implementation plans designed to meet the individual resident's needs. Program Coordinators develop written programs to be implemented in the home by the Certified Family Home provider and provide one-on-one trainings to assist with these programs to enhance independent living skills for the resident.



Getting Started ...

What services are available through Program Coordination?

- Face to face meetings with providers and participants
- Initial orientation and ongoing training
- Create and monitor program implementation plans including running programs, data collection, figuring monthly percentages, and completing provider status reviews
- Behavior consultation and creating behavior plans
- Information on community training and resources
- Ongoing contact with providers to review program implementation plans
- Monitor, document, and report issues of adult abuse, neglect, exploitation, health and safety, certification and implementation compliance
- Assistance with Molina billing as requested



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Where do I start if I want to become a Certified Family Home provider?

Your first step is to complete an application with Health and Welfare.
